Confidence building in Maths

A lot of children find that they struggle with maths and problem solving. This can make them feel that they are no good at maths and often we can tell children not to worry, they may not be good at maths but they are good at other things. Having done a lot of reading and research over the summer holidays, the staff throughout the school are trying to tackle this way of thinking as it gives children a negative, fixed mindset. We are working towards giving the children a mathematical growth mindset that says, "Ok, so I can't do it right now, so what can I do to solve it?"

One of the best ways to help children develop a positive mindset towards maths is to encourage group work and to talk about and visualise/draw mathematical problems. With this in mind, the children throughout the school will be doing a lot more group work in maths but will regularly work with different children, not just those that are seemingly at the same level as them. We feel that this will have a great impact on the children's confidence and ultimately their attainment in maths.
